West Moreton Health

West Moreton Health is comprised of four local government areas (LGAs) - Scenic Rim Regional Council, Lockyer Valley Regional Council, Somerset Regional Council and Ipswich City Council. Ipswich is the major city in the hospital and health service, with the townships of Esk, Laidley, Gatton, Boonah and Wacol spread throughout the area.

West Moreton Health provides public services for residents across the continuum of health care including preventative and primary health care services, ambulatory services, acute care, sub-acute care, oral health, and mental health and specialised services (including prisoner health and alcohol and other drugs).

West Moreton Health's population was approximately 314,000 people in 2021 and is projected to be 511,000 people by 2031 – an increase of 62 per cent increase at a rate of 4.5% per annum, which is the fastest rate of growth of all Hospital and Health Services in Queensland. West Moreton Health's demographic and geographic profile is diverse. Five per cent off our residents identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander and ten per cent were born outside Australia, whilst also encompassing metropolitan and small rural community settings.


Hospital Facilities

RMO Education and Training Opportunities

Medical Education Unit

The Medical Education Unit (MEU) is responsible for managing the assessment process, coordinating education and training opportunities, managing the junior doctor education and training accreditation process, career advice and support.

The Medical Education Unit team includes, Director of Clinical Training (DCT), Principal Medical Education Officer, Medical Education Officers, Medical Education Administrative Officers.

The MEU is open Monday to Friday during business hours.

Education sessions provided at Ipswich Hospital include:

- Junior Doctor Education Program 2 x 1-hour sessions per week which consist of both tutorial and practical based learning
- Department specific presentations held on a weekly basis which includes case studies, presentations, Grand Rounds, Journal Club, and department meetings to review teamwork and training strategies.
- Pocket Simulation Centre in Anaesthetics and Emergency Medicine
- Ward-call Orientation Program
- Internal Advanced Life Support Program
- Residents are encouraged to attend any additional education sessions provided within the hospital, including
 plastering demonstrations, ECG workshops, ALS and APLS courses held in-house.

Medical officers are employed under the terms and conditions of the Medical Officers Award – State 2015 and current Medical Officers' (Queensland Health) Certified Agreement.

Working Hours

Ordinary hours of duty are 76 hours per fortnight. Medical officers may be required to work weekend shifts, night shifts, on-call / remote-call shifts, and overtime as required. Appointment is not facility specific; you may be required to work at any facility within the health service.

Junior Medical Workforce

A dedicated Medical Workforce team to guide you through the onboarding process.

REG/PHO selection of candidates is made by the relevant departments you are applying for. Selections are merit based and may involve interviews.

Cgov med-e-recruit online Pre-employment check must be completed **prior** to receiving a Letter of Employment. This will be emailed to the successful applicant once the selection has been completed in the RMO portal. You will be required to provide the following through the Cgov portal:

- CV no older than 12 months
- References 2 required, 1 being from most recent supervisor
- Identification (i.e. Passport) must be certified
 Criminal history consent form
- Current registration with the Medical Board of Australia or the ability to obtain appropriate Registration
- Visa status working rights in Australia

- Vaccine Preventable Diseases evidence is required for all of the following:
 - Hep B
 - Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
 - Varicella
 - Pertussis
- Declaration of Serious Discipline Action Form
- TB Assessment Form
