Join our dynamic team of dedicated addiction and mental health professionals at MSAMHS, a major healthcare provider, delivering both inpatient and community specialist mental health and alcohol and drug services to a large and culturally diverse population.



MSAMHS provides mental health care and addiction services to the largest culturally and linguistically diverse population in the state, and to the regions that have some of the highest population growth in the country.

In addition to the inpatient and community services, we also deliver acute care services which may be undertaken in the consumer's home, in general practitioner surgeries or in emergency departments.

Services are provided across the lifespan, from child and youth to adult, as well as older persons through our specialist programs.

MSAMHS also provides professional training, early prevention, community rehabilitation, homeless outreach, indigenous liaison, suicide prevention, neuropsychiatry, addiction medicine, education and research, through our numerous partnerships with universities and other centres of learning.

Registrar

Bayside, Logan and Princess Alexandra Hospital offer a wide range of training opportunities across 80 available positions. Each campus, due to their location, demographics and service profiles offers differing training experiences.

Our service provides opportunity for involvement in research including partnerships with Queensland Brain Institute, Griffith University, Queensland University of Technology and the University of Queensland. Consultants are separately credentialled when required to supervise ECT.

Rotations in Older Adults Mental Health, Acute Inpatient Services, Acute Care, Emergency Departments, Community Care Units and Consultation Liaison. Each campus also works closely with Addiction Services and has access to Transcultural Services. Child and Youth Mental rotations are offered at Logan and Redland Hospital campuses.

MSAMHS provides supervision with a number of accredited supervisors and there will be an opportunity for registrars to gain training in CBT, CRT, suicide risk assessment, ECT, DBT. Other specific training experiences can be accommodated by enquiry. The research and learning branch of MSAMHS will foster and support registrars in their scholarly projects. There are specific accredited registrar posts for indigenous mental health.
