- 40 bed Acute and Restorative Care for the Older Person Unit Nambour Hospital including 8 bed secure unit (Core training)

After Hours Coverage Roster: Geriatrics weekend rounds 1:4 half day duties with week day off in lieu. After hours admitting shift for subspecialties about monthly.	Ward responsibilities/workload: Most inpatient units 12 patients with intern or Junior House Officer (JHO); Leading weekly MDT Case conferences Community Geriatrics – TCP and subacute program patients including weekly case conference. Home visits. RaSS – emergency care for RACF residents both as part of a mobile outreach service and embedded in ED
Consultations: Each registrar covers all consults for their area/ unit.	Specialist Clinic cover Generally weekly OPD with exception of RaSS Reg

<p>Teaching responsibilities: Local clinical school with medical students in most rotations Teaching for basic physician trainees Teaching multidisciplinary team members</p>	<p>Rotations available and opportunities for flexible training: Accredited for core training in Acute geriatrics, Stroke (though this is also offered to neurology trainees so less readily available), Orthogeriatrics, Subacute Inpatients including rehabilitation and management of BPSD, Community and RaSS service. Whilst accredited for 7 core positions would probably take up to 5 advanced trainees at any one time. Open to discussions around parttime work.</p>
